State of Rhode Island Monthly Local Hotel Report FY 2016 Local 1.0 Percent Collections July 2015

Beginning in June 2010, the Rhode Island Department of Revenue will issue a monthly report on the collection and distribution of the local 1.0 percent hotel tax. The report is meant to be descriptive and does not purport to project or assess the collection of the local 1.0 percent hotel tax. The report provides data by municipality on the month-to-month, year-over-year, and fiscal year-to-date-over-fiscal year-to-date collections. A discussion of the municipalities with the largest and smallest percentage and nominal changes in these three measures will be included in the body of the report.

The July 2015 local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections report is the first report in FY 2016 that includes tax receipts generated from the expansion of the local hotel tax base. Effective July 1, 2015, the reselling of lodging by online travel companies, the unlicensed rental of accommodations via internet platforms and other media, and vacation home rentals became subject to the local 1.0 percent hotel tax. At this time, the Office of Revenue Analysis is unable to identify the amount collected from each of these local hotel tax base expansion components. Thus, an unknown amount of local 1.0 percent hotel tax receipts are presumed to be captured in this report. Efforts will be made to identify local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections attributable to the expansion of the local 1.0 percent hotel tax base in future reports.

Analysis of Month-to-Month Collections

On a statewide basis, July 2015 local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections totaled \$534,771 or 49.2 percent more than the \$358,427 collected in June 2015. The five communities with the largest percentage increase in local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections between July 2015 and June 2015 were: Charlestown, 297.1 percent; Narragansett, 138.8 percent; Bristol, 124.4 percent; New Shoreham, 123.6 percent; and Westerly, 121.3 percent. The one community with a percentage decrease in local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections between July 2015 and June 2015 was North Smithfield, -61.5 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increase in local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections between July 2015 and June 2015 were: Newport, \$37,770; Westerly, \$33,153; Middletown, \$23,742; New Shoreham, \$22,844; and Providence, \$15,729. The one community with a nominal decrease in local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections between July 2015 and June 2015 was: North Smithfield, \$(230).

Analysis of Year-over-Year Collections by Month

On a statewide basis, July 2015 local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections totaled \$534,771 or 24.9 percent more than the \$428,292 collected in July 2014. The five communities with the largest percentage increase in local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections between July 2015 and July 2014 were: Glocester, 161.0 percent; Cranston, 86.3 percent; Little Compton, 83.2 percent; Charlestown, 78.2 percent; and Portsmouth, 67.2 percent. The two communities with a percentage decrease in local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections between July 2015 and July 2014 were: Jamestown, -2.5 percent; and Richmond, -0.3 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increase in local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections between July 2015 and July 2014 were: Newport, \$32,861; Providence, \$22,961; Warwick, \$11,152; Westerly, \$11,081; and Middletown, \$7,227. The two communities with a nominal decrease in local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections between July 2015 and July 2014 were: Jamestown, \$(21); and Richmond, \$(1).

<u>Analysis of Fiscal Year-to-Date Collections through July</u>

In the first month of the fiscal year, the analysis of fiscal year-to-date collections through July is the same as the analysis of year-over-year collections by month. Thus, no additional analysis on the local 1.0 percent hotel tax is possible at this time.
