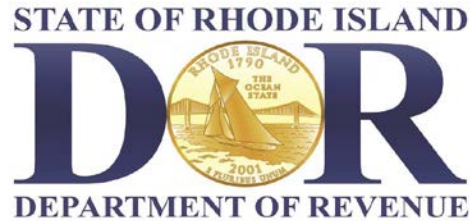

**State of Rhode Island Monthly State Hotel Tax Report  
FY 2020 State 5.0 Percent Hotel Tax Allocation July 2019**

In June 2012, the Rhode Island Department of Revenue began issuing a report on the allocation of the state 5.0 percent hotel tax as required by Rhode Island General Laws §§ 42-63.1-3 and 42-63.1-12. The report is meant to be descriptive and does not purport to project or assess the collection of the state 5.0 percent hotel tax. The report provides information on the year-over-year and fiscal year-to-date over fiscal year-to-date allocation of the revenues collected for the state 5.0 percent hotel tax. The state 5.0 percent hotel tax is levied on the rental of rooms in traditional hotels/motels as well as the rental of rooms as transient lodging by room resellers and via hosting platforms.

State hotel tax collections are received by the Division of Taxation and the City of Newport in the month following the rental activity and distributed the subsequent month. For example, state hotel tax collected from a room rental in July is received in August and distributed in September. It should be noted that early payments, late payments, and adjustments may be included in this report.

**How State Hotel Tax Revenues are Distributed**

It is important to note that the distribution of the state hotel tax revenues generated by the rental of rooms via a hosting platform was changed effective July 1, 2019.

- For returns and payments received prior to July 1, 2019, state hotel tax collections were distributed based on the allocation percentages provided in Rhode Island General Laws § 42-63.1-3(f). Of the state hotel tax revenues generated from the rental of rooms via hosting platforms, 25% were distributed to the host municipality and 75% were distributed to the Rhode Island Commerce Corporation.
- For returns and payments received after June 30, 2019, the distribution of the state hotel tax is made in accordance with the allocation percentages provided in Rhode Island General Laws § 42-63.1-3(g). All state hotel tax revenues, including revenues generated from the rental of rooms via hosting platforms, are distributed according to the percentages noted in the table below.

The state hotel tax allocation percentages for the periods covered by this report are as follows:

### **Hotel Situs and Regional Tourism Districts**

According to Rhode Island General Laws § 42-63.1-5, Rhode Island is divided into eight regional tourism districts, which are administered by either a regional council, a municipal government entity, or, as in the case of the Statewide Tourism District, the Rhode Island Commerce Corporation. The tourism districts and member municipalities are as follows:

- Aquidneck Island: Barrington, Bristol, Jamestown, Little Compton, Middletown, Newport, Portsmouth, Tiverton, and Warren
- Block Island: New Shoreham
- Convention Authority of the City of Providence: Providence
- East Providence: Unaffiliated. If the city joins a tourism district, all accrued and future revenues generated from the state 5.0 percent hotel tax will be paid to that tourism district.
- Northern Rhode Island: Burrillville, Central Falls, Cumberland, Glocester, Lincoln, North Smithfield, Pawtucket, Smithfield and Woonsocket

- South County: Charlestown, Coventry, East Greenwich, Exeter, Hopkinton, Narragansett, North Kingstown, Richmond, South Kingstown, West Greenwich, and Westerly
- Statewide Tourism District: Cranston, Foster, Johnston, North Providence, Scituate, and West Warwick
- Warwick Department of Economic Development: Warwick

### **Summary of the State 5.0 Percent Hotel Tax Allocation**

#### ***Year over Year Allocation for July:***

The following table is a summary of the year over year allocation of revenues generated from the state 5.0 percent hotel tax. Caution is recommended in the interpretation of year-over-year percentage and nominal differences as the allocation of the state hotel tax revenues has changed.

#### ***Fiscal Year-to-Date over Fiscal Year-to-Date through July:***

Given that July is the first month of the fiscal year there are no differences between monthly and fiscal year-to-date state hotel tax collections.

### **Detail of the State 5.0 Percent Hotel Tax Allocation**

The tables *Detail of Rhode Island State 5.0% Hotel Tax Allocation* provides a breakdown of state hotel tax receipts by regional tourism district and the sources of state hotel tax receipts for the Rhode Island Commerce Corporation and the Providence Warwick Convention & Visitors Bureau. The detail provided includes both year over year and fiscal year-to-date over fiscal year-to-date

receipts. Information on the state hotel tax receipts generated by room resellers and via hosting platforms, on a year over year basis, is included in the *Collections by Component* tables.

### ***Municipalities***

The tables *Rhode Island State 5.0% Hotel Tax Allocation to Municipalities* provides data by municipality on the year-over-year collections for the state hotel tax. A color coding scheme is used to indicate the municipalities with the largest percentage and nominal increases and decreases. The largest five percentage and nominal increases are shaded in green with the darkest green shade representing the largest value and the lightest green shade representing the fifth largest value. An analogous shading scheme is used for the largest five percentage and nominal decreases with red being used in place of green. Information on the state hotel tax receipts generated by room resellers and via hosting platforms, on a year over year basis, is included in the *Collections by Component* tables.
