# State of Rhode Island Monthly Local Hotel Report FY 2015 Local 1.0 Percent Collections February 2015

Beginning in June 2010, the Rhode Island Department of Revenue will issue a monthly report on the collection and distribution of the local 1.0 percent hotel tax. The report is meant to be descriptive and does not purport to project or assess the collection of the local 1.0 percent hotel tax. The report provides data by municipality on the month-to-month, year-over-year, and fiscal year-to-date-over-fiscal year-to-date collections. A discussion of the municipalities with the largest and smallest percentage and nominal changes in these three measures will be included in the body of the report.

#### **Analysis of Month-to-Month Collections**

On a statewide basis, February 2015 local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections totaled \$141,220 or 1.2 percent less than the \$142,890 collected in January 2015. The five communities with the largest percentage increase in local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections between February 2015 and January 2015 were: Jamestown, 458.4 percent; New Shoreham, 108.1 percent; Glocester, 96.2 percent; Cranston, 40.3 percent; and North Smithfield, 33.6 percent. The five communities with the largest percentage decrease in local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections between February 2015 and January 2015 were: Foster and Little Compton, -100.0 percent; Portsmouth, -28.9 percent; Newport, -17.2 percent; and East Greenwich, -13.9 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increase in local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections between February 2015 and January 2015 were: Warwick, \$3,735; Middletown, \$871; Coventry, \$459; West Warwick, \$357; and Lincoln, \$339. The five communities with the largest nominal decrease in local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections between February 2015 and January 2015: Newport, \$(4,458); Providence, \$(3,844); South Kingstown, \$(245); Westerly, \$(90); and East Providence, \$(75).

#### Analysis of Year-over-Year Collections by Month

On a statewide basis, February 2015 local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections totaled \$141,220 or 11.5 percent more than the \$126,603 collected in February 2014. The five communities with the largest percentage increase in local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections between February 2015 and February 2014 were: New Shoreham, 194.4 percent; Portsmouth, 163.7 percent; Jamestown, 76.1 percent; West Warwick, 61.8 percent; and North Kingstown, 43.5 percent. The five communities with the largest percentage decrease in local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections between February 2015 and February 2014 were: Foster and Little Compton, -100.0 percent; East Greenwich, -59.8 percent; Pawtucket, -30.8 percent; and North Smithfield, -29.3 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increase in local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections between February 2015 and February 2014 were: Warwick, \$4,936; Providence, \$4,254; Newport, \$3,412; West Warwick, \$1,087; and North Kingstown, \$638. The five communities with the largest nominal decrease in local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections between February 2015 and February 2014 were: Pawtucket, \$(630); Westerly, \$(349); Bristol, \$(200); South Kingstown, \$(192); and Foster \$(46).

#### Analysis of Fiscal Year-to-Date Collections through February

On a statewide basis, fiscal year-to-date February 2015 local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections totaled \$2.38 million or 8.0 percent more than the \$2.21 million collected in fiscal year-to-date February 2014. The five communities with the largest percentage increase in local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections between fiscal year-to-date February 2015 and fiscal year-to-date February 2014 were: Portsmouth, 47.5 percent; Jamestown and Johnston, 29.3 percent; Scituate, 28.9 percent; and Richmond, 25.7 percent. The five communities with the largest percentage decrease in local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections between fiscal year-to-date February 2015 and fiscal year-to-date February 2014 were: Little Compton, -91.2 percent; East Greenwich, -36.2 percent; Glocester, -23.6 percent; North Smithfield, -10.1 percent; and Cranston, -8.9 percent.

The five communities with the largest nominal increase in local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections between fiscal year-to-date February 2015 and fiscal year-to-date February 2014 were: Newport, \$47,579; Providence, \$38,666; Westerly, \$25,642; Warwick, \$25,266; and Middletown, \$23,957. The five communities with the largest nominal decrease in local 1.0 percent hotel tax collections between fiscal year-to-date February 2015 and fiscal year-to-date February 2014 were: New Shoreham, \$(2,372); Little Compton, \$(1,615); West Greenwich, \$(1,368); Pawtucket, \$(644); and Charlestown, \$(425).
